RE: SEEKING CONSIDERATION OF EXTENSION TO SCI REENTRY PROGRAM:

Dear Mrs. Webster:

This program entitled basic advance learning education is created as an extension of the SCI (or any reentry) REENTRY PROGRAM in implementation here and around the State of Wisconsin. This component -----  
-project more than completes and brings about as a whole, the reentry concept? These classes will be ran like a siminar.

As we know that the SCI Reentry prog. fulfills the concepts of wellness, education, employment, family support, financial literacy, health, housing, personal developement, transportation and transitional preparation. But what it doesn't do, is discuss, esp., the basic technological advancements that society has continued to embark on such as the following:

I. How will those individuals, that have been incarcerated since the 60s, 70s, and 80s; some over 45 years ago, adjust to all of the new technological advancements of today? Inventions created since they have been incarcerated, valued items that are in use everyday that did not even exist when they were in the free world, such things as:

- 1). The fact that all new cars are 98% electric with sensor controls ran by a computer chip. Cars need no keys to start nowadays.
- 2) Public telephones and their present cost to use?.....
- 3) Public laundrymats and their present cost to use?
- 4). THE fact that you can pay your bills from your iphone or turn on your house lights, heat, upon being in abother state, city open up your car-garage or see whats going on in your own home through a camera, you can see all this even while flying in an airplane. etc.
- 5). Toilet bowls work by sensor motion & computer-chips.
- 6). Convenient stores are everywhere open 24-hours aday.
- 7). Large retail store chains sale food in big bulk large quantities at smalls lower prices. Whereat you can check out/scan your own food items out yourself. Now you can scan and bag up your own

food items.

- 8). Nowaday, a bus pass is used like a computer Card, you swipe like you would swipe a credit card, upon first entering a bus. Reading and comprehending a bus schedule is a learning experience in itself!
- 9). Most people out in society have microwaves to 'COOK' with now!
- 10). They have 'pay at the pump for gas, now'. You swipe the gas pump with your credit Card.
- 11). In washrooms now, they have paper towel bins that have motion sensor in them, that when you reach for a paper towel it falls in your hands.
- 12). In the world at large, the public restroom have motion sensors washbasins whereas you simply put your hands under the faucet and it automatically comes on and shuts off when you pull your hands away.
- 13). Society now have what is called 'ATMS'. They are substitutes for Banks. You need to use your code to get at your bank account for money. They charge you a fee for using an ATM which could be located even on your own block.!
- 14). Your parole agent can assist you and point you in the right direction to purchase a Bus pass or tokens.
- 15). Most homes have motion detector sensors around their property including cameras.
- 16). The public urinals function on motion sensors. When you step in front of them (the sensors) and step away from the urinal, it flushes on its own.
- 17). Hand sanitizer is being used everywhere. It is used in the stores, hospitals etc.
- 18). People are texting each other from everywhere, family, friends etc.
- 19). There is the use of Blue Tooth iphones.
- 20). Public libraries offer computer link ups; coffeeshops also offer computer link ups.
- 21). All offenders must learn the texting vocabulary.
- 22). Society now have I Max Theaters, with chairs that recline and the cost to get in this theaters is also higher,
- 23). They have touch screen iphones in society now.
- 24). They have electric tooth brushes in society now.
- 25). They have M.P. three players now.
- 26). You can expect to see more Camers on the streets in society now.

- 27). Today, you must find ways to save-up the funds you earn?
- 28). You might want to travel alot with a friend or family-member until you are use to being on your own. Take a day or two to explore your community and other places.
- 29). Be cautious, because out there in society there is Real Road Rage. be aware of it.
- 30). Restaurants now serve signature foods(when they sell foods like pancakes with chocolate, whipcream and asorted fruits etc.
- 31). You may have 'anxieties', so realize and face head on your fears, and if need be, don't be afraid to get professional help.

The B.A.L.E. program is an introduction to all the technological advances in your community and society at large. This primary concept Reentry reenforced by the BALE program. This program is needed because the old timers have been incarcerated so long that they have no knowledge of what they will be faced with once they are released.? Realistically, not knowing any or all of this is at the offenders detriment.

The objective of being released is because of/or that the prison system, at some point, believes that you, the offender, are ready to succeed in society, and that you have been rehabilitated or have legally reached your Mandatory Release(M.R.) or Discharge. Everyone including the Women offenders, on their way to being released can either, be enrolled in this program addendum or be given a copy and in the least, questedned by either clinical staff or the social-worker of any segregation unti or ifthat o-ffender is in a health service hospital unit-bed.

This additional project to the Reentry Program can disclose to those offenders incarcerated since the sixties, seventies and eighties, those parts of society esp., in their repective communities where they both male and female offenders with be confronted with technological advanced creations that will challenge these offenders on a daily basis,

The final stage of this project will end with a group discussion along with the process of a siminar-type show and tell exchange. Its important at this stage we discuss this topic of 'whats out there' in society that as a prisoner, I should be made aware of. At each group session, we can display and have an asortment of handouts plus demonstrations on how things work and how you go about getting from point A to Z. Note; further classes on how things are used may have to cover some rushed circumstances when an offender male/female snetence is cut short by the Courts or prison administration.

#### HOW TO FACILITATE THE GROUP DISCUSSION:

All of these advanced Gadgets and devices will be listed and read outloud. They can be introduced to the group by displaying them openly and/or on display via slidescreen, TV-VCR and/or openly passed around.

All class meetings will be held in a circular type formation in the middle of the room. The facilitators can pass around as many of these items/gadgets/devices as possible. The class facilitator will also begin all conversation or designate where the topic of discussion will begin. As the flowing conversation continues (from one class participant to another, without skipping anyone"note: EVERYONE involved in the class will be entitled to participate in this learning session") to progress around the circle, until it reaches the last individual. Providing that there is time left before the session ends. It will be up to the class facilitator, should there be time left, rather to continue or start another new subject.

All facilitators must be certified in either counseling or college educated, and/or have hands on experience coming out of prison. Lastly, I want to thank you in advance for any and all consideration that you give this proposal. I look forward to your response.
