

I was raised in an abusive household until the age of 12 yrs. old. We moved to Milwaukee from Cleveland to live with my mother after she was released from Taycheedah. Then being raised in a single parent home took it's toll. As we got older, we got rebellious. I started using drugs & drinking as a teenager and didn't stop till I reached the ~~penitent~~ prison system. I am a first time offender. I got in some minor trouble in my life, but once I turned 25 I was primed & ready for the greatest test & failure of my life. Life really does seem to be over at this stage. I have yet to even see parole. I am under the new law 13y 4mo life sentenced. The judge set my parole eligibility at 26 to life. My support system out there has dwindled down over the years. I've learned a whole lot of lil' prison life lessons. Tie those in with what I already knew, plus a shot of maturity and you come up with a man ready to be reinstated into society as a contributing member. As it stands, I will probably be working well into my 70's. Because I don't see parole till I'm 52 and the way I hear it. No violent offender gets out first time up. I don't have a spot less prison conduct record. I have however done a few things to give back to the community via the BRICK program ^{Inmate} coordinator at GBCI as well as speaking to a homicide investigators conference about my crime. Because I have nothing to hide, it basically seems that I have nothing to lose. Only the future will tell if things are to go well for me. 11X15 is a beacon of hope right now. It remains to be seen what will take place. Till then I will walk in wisdom & by faith.
