If you are recommended for a parole grant/release, the time frame within which you shall be released, as established by the Chairperson of the Parole Commission, shall be reflected in the grant/order.

GENERAL REASONS FOR ACTION TAKEN

1. You have NOT served sufficient time for punishment.
2. Your institutional conduct has been satisfactory.
3. Your program participation has NOT been satisfactory.
4. You have developed an adequate plan, but will need Agent's verification.
5. Release at this time would involve an unreasonable risk to the public.

COMMISSION COMMENTS

You are incarcerated for 3 Cts. Battery (Rptr), 2nd Deg. Sexual Assault (Rptr), and False Imprisonment (Rptr). These offenses occurred in May '94, while on Parole supervision for Burglary and Probation for Theft. The Parole and Probation cases were both revoked and have since discharged. The new offenses involved a domestic dispute between you and a girlfriend, whom you had dated for just a short time. According to reports, she went to your residence to return your keys, as she no longer wanted to have a relationship with you. You were reportedly consuming alcohol, became involved in assaultive behavior towards her, forced sexual contact with the victim, and prevented her from leaving your residence for a period of time. You take full responsibility for your offending, and admit that you are completely to blame for finding yourself in prison with such a lengthy sentence structure. You are now in prison for the 2nd time as an adult, have served over 22 years of continuous confinement to date, and over 20 years on the current 33 year CS sentence structure. However, considering all of the circumstances, serving additional time for punishment is warranted. Further, your case does carry PMR status. Your institution conduct remains satisfactory, noting no new CR's in over 3 years to date. As for programming, you have successfully completed Anger Management, DV Counseling, and multiple Voc. Ed. programs. You have gained some excellent insight into your past difficulties and ongoing struggles, and are motivated to complete your remaining program needs of SO-4 and AODA Residential. The Commission previously endorsed your placement into SO-4, but when interviewed for the program in Sept. 2013, staff denied your enrollment stating that you denied memory of your offenses. In the Commission's interactions with you, you have accepted full responsibility for your crimes, but state that you have difficulty remembering some of the events due to being extremely intoxicated at the time. Considering this, the Commission continues to endorse your enrollment in SO-4, and is requesting that program staff re-interview you for the program. The Commission previously spoke with you about a possible transfer to OSCI for enrollment in the SO-4 programming at that site, also noting your AODA Residential program need is offered at OSCI as well. You stated that because your case originated near that area, you believe the staff there singled you out and treated you unfairly during your last confinement at OSCI. As a result, you have made it clear that you have no interest in being returned to OSCI. The Commission has done everything within its authority to assist you in enrolling in SO-4 programming, to no avail. In the end, it is really up to you to convince staff that you are an appropriate candidate for enrollment in this program, as you will remain an unreasonable risk for a discretionary release without it. Your parole plan is to reside with your sister in Brillion, WI upon release, and this will require the approval of your Parole Agent, when more timeframe appropriate. It is noted that your sisters and others have written into the Parole Commission expressing their support for you, and this is taken into consideration at your parole reviews. In conclusion, additional time, continued good conduct, successful completion of your remaining essential/offense-related program needs of SO-4 and AODA Residential, eventual clearance by ECRB, transition through reduced security with a positive adjustment along the way, and eventually an approved parole plan will all be necessary in reducing your risk to a more reasonable level.
