Per the criminal complaint on 11/22/13 officers responded to a residence for an entry complaint. When the officers arrived, they spoke with an alarm company security guard who indicated they had received 2 alarm "trips" which indicated someone had broken into the residence. Officers observed that the back door of the residence had been forced open. The security guard indicated that the account was listed to Mr. Cherry. Believing a burglary might be occurring the officers entered the residence and cleared it looking for potential burglary suspects. The officers noticed a strong odor of fresh marijuana. Officer T. went into the basement where he noted the smell was becoming stronger. While clearing the basement Officer T. opened the door to a closet in the main basement room and upon doing so he was overpowered by the smell of fresh marijuana and he observed a large black nylon duffel bag sitting unzipped in the closet. Inside the bag, Officer T. observed that there were 2 large rectangular shapes wrapped in heavy black garbage bags. The officer believed these bags to contain bricks of marijuana. Officer T. then cleared the rest of the basement. When Officer G. joined Officer T. in the basement, Officer G. observed a stock and muzzle of a rifle sticking out above a heating duct in the ceiling next to the base of the stairs. While on the scene, an individual identified as Mr. Cherry, arrived in a vehicle and was detained. Officers then secured the scene and prepared a search warrant, which was then authorized. During the search of the residence officers located a semiautomatic rifle with one round in the chamber and 9 rounds in the magazine, marijuana, US currency, suspected cocaine, a vacuum sealing machine, personal records and letters listing to Mr. Cherry and a large box for a hydroponic growing system. In the master bedroom the officer located a revolved loaded with 4 cartridges, a wallet that containing numerous identifying documents listing to Mr. Cherry, US Currency, 3 cell phones (in the same drawer), a bag containing suspected ecstasy pills, 4 loose unfired firearm cartridges, 11 cell phones in the top drawer of a dresser, a handgun belt holster, suspected marijuana as well as numerous identifying documents listing to Mr. Cherry throughout the room. In the kitchen the officers found 6 digital scales, some of which had marijuana residue on them, a role of black plastic bags (similar to those located in the basement) and a box of gallon size bags, several which had suspected marijuana residue inside them. A money counting machine was located in the living room. Officer also seized 8 flat screen TVs, 3 laptop

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computer, 2 printer/scanners and a computer monitor, modem and keyboard.
The suspected marijuana found in the residence tested positive. The marijuana found in the basement weighed 10,403 grams (approximately 23 pounds) and that which was found in the master bedroom weighed 225 grams (1/2 pound). The suspected cocaine tested positive and weighed 243 grams (approximately 8 1/2 ounces). The suspected ecstasy pills tested positive for MDMA. There were a total of 114 3/4 pills that weighed 34 grams.

Motivation and Attitude at Reclassification: No changes as of 04/19/2018. Mr. Cherry previously stated that this was a "party house". He stated he and his brother along with two friends had rented the house. He denied that drugs were being sold out of the house. He said he took the "weight" for the this case. Mr. Cherry admitted to the marijuana but denied knowledge of the cocaine and one of the guns. He reported he had "traded" a different gun. He denied ever purchasing a gun. He admitted he started back selling about seven months before this occurred. He said he only made \$5000 to \$6000 with each time he received 100 pound marijuana shipment. Mr. Cherry stated that 2013 was a "bad year" for him. He said his son's mother and son were robbed and he became depressed after this. He said it was a hard time for him. He admitted he became involved in selling drugs again because he needed the money. He said he would take it all back and do it differently if he could. At this interview, Mr. Cherry reports he is past all this and wants to keep moving forward.

Dynamics: Mr. Cherry was the third man leaving the residence - his two garbage bags contained 19 large freezer bags filled with marijuana - 8,541.19 grams (approximately 18.8 pounds). He was also found to have \$1,135 on his person. He told officers that he did not own the marijuana, but that he was intending to "middle-man" drug deals so he could make money.

He understands the factor to be taken into consideration are found in DOC 302.</p> <p>Mr. Cherry stated "Mr. Cherry stated The crimes that I committed and that brought me to prison also brings great pain to my family. I am looking for a better life and a better start. I am thinking positive and not putting myself in situations where there are the thoughts and behaviors I use to have. I did sign an 18 month commitment with KCC and I would really appreciate that being approved. I will not let you or my family down. 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Staff Appraisal and Recommendations (Pre-Hearing)

Mr. Cherry currently does not hold an institution position as he is enrolled in school as of 02/19/2018. His most recent school evaluation he signed on 04/18/2018 so he does not have a copy to present at this time, he did say that he received 32 out of 33 points. Mr. Cherry stated that going to school is currently a basic refresher for him. He also stated that it has been all of years since he used that information and he wants to apply these skills when he is released so that he does not come back to prison. He knows that he needs to enhance his education level.

Mr. Cherry has maintained positive institution adjustment and has not received any major or minor conduct reports during his incarceration. Unit staff report that Mr. Cherry is polite and respectful to both staff and peers, and that he does not cause problematic issues on the unit.

A COMPAS Core Assessment was completed on 05/24/2016. He has an overall risk level of medium. Mr. Cherry COMPAS case plan was reviewed and updated. His goals include getting into his programming to develop skills to enhance his employability, and to develop a better understanding of his thoughts and decisions. Mr. Cherry identified his criminogenic need as Antisocial Associates. He stated that it was his friends and environment around him that he grew up with. He understands that he needs to develop and maintain pro-social relationships. He plans to continue working on his plan when placed in high risk situations.

Mr. Cherry has earned a total of 5 behavior modification points. This was a program on the F-unit that recognized when an inmate exhibited pro-social behaviors. He was not able to redeem his points prior to the program ending in March of 2018.

Mr. Cherry stated he earned his High School Diploma from Shalom High School (Milwaukee) in 1994. With regard to preparing for his re-entry to the community, Mr. Cherry stated he has completed a couple of the re-entry modules. The modules have been determined to be more self-study.

Mr. Cherry is on the waiting list for Vocational-primary programming. Per his JOC, Mr. Cherry is not eligible for ERP/CIP. Mr. Cherry has a signed 18 month commitment with Kenosha Correctional Center for driving dated on 04/19/2018. This was approved through the Superintendent at KCC.

Based on a file review and a face to face interview, Social Worker recommends Minimum community Custody with retention at KCC. Mr. Cherry is encouraged to continue updating his COMPAS case plan, participate in voluntary programs, maintain his schooling, and continue his positive institutional adjustment.

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Committee Comments

This Scheduled review was conducted pursuant to WI Administrative Code 302, and addresses custody, site placement and program assignments.

Mr. Cherry is serving his 3rd incarceration (2nd in WI; 1 prior in IA) as a New Admit. He arrived at RGCI on 08/31/16; transferring from A&E.

Program needs assigned: Academic Refresher(Enrolled) and Vocational(Primary). CBP(T4C) is being added to program needs this review period as based on COMPAS CORE completed on 05/24/16 his Criminal Involvement risk score is Medium and Criminal Associates and Peers risk score is Highly Probable. These risk scores rated highly probable or probable(Medium) are used when assigning CBP.

A COMPAS Core assessment was completed on 05/24/16.

COMPAS Risk Scores

Violent Recidivism: Low

General Recidivism: Medium

COMPAS Risk Level Recommendation: Medium

CIP: Not Eligible; JOC Denies, No AODA, Age Restriction

ERP: Not Eligible; JOC Denies, No AODA

He has no known Pending charges, SPNS, Escape, or STG affiliation

This review was conducted pursuant to WI Administrative Code 302, and addresses custody, site placement, and program assignments. The committee unanimously recommends Minimum community custody with KCC placement. He has signed a 18 month Driver commitment at KCC with approval from Superintendent.

His sentence structure is significant in decision however consideration for driver commitment with 18 month work commitment was noted. Review of risk factors included nonviolent offense that involved the sale of drugs with risk that included possession of firearms that he stated was result of monetary gain. In regards to future plans he intends to drive trucks as a subcontractor when released for income. A reported trigger of his criminal activity is his antisocial associates. He understands that he needs to develop pro-social relationships. He reported at committee he is staying focused on not hanging out with negative influences while incarcerated. It is noted that he has no conduct reports overall this incarceration since intake on 03/30/16. He is recently participated in Academic Refresher with positive participation. He has minimal offense related program assignment with CBP added just this review period. He understands that despite recommendation and current work commitment that with his current sentence structure he will be expected to complete assigned programming in the future.

It is noted that he had prior incarceration with release from FCCC on 11/23/00 with no reported issues. His prior incarceration included no major conduct report issues. He has no reported Escape history. He has no clinical, medical, or dental issues that would preclude recommended placement. He is expected to maintain positive institution adjustment and successfully complete his signed work commitment. The WCCS Superintendent and DAI warden determines work release and/or project position placements.

A 12 month recall has been set as there are no expected changes.

Inmates may request an Administrative Review of the Classification decision pursuant to DOC 302.18 by filing a

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current DOC-1292 Administrative Review of Classification Decision form within 10 days of receipt of the final decision. Administrative Reviews are based on erroneous information, not disagreement with custody and/or placement recommendation.
