The crimes I am convicted of are 2 counts of Robbery of a Financial Institution. Please ~~take~~ note that I went to trial and has maintained my innocence since the day I was accused of these crimes. My case is built off of testimony of people who I did not get along with, have had fights and arguments with, an ex-girlfriend, and some people who did not identify me then but later identified me. Also note the perpetrator who committed these crimes has 3 solid teardrop tattoos on his face, I do not and yet everyone describes this in their statement, but I was still convicted. I was railroaded.

12. Explain the extraordinary circumstances that you believe warrant a waiver of the Governor's eligibility rules. For example, an extraordinary circumstance could be, but is not necessarily, the fact that the conviction prohibits you from obtaining specific employment. However, the desire to hunt or possess a firearm for hunting purposes does not constitute extraordinary circumstances.

I really wouldn't know, I don't like guns, I was a student. What I would like to say is, I don't believe it's fair to be wrongfully convicted, as well as being given 3 different sentences calculating up to 20 years 2 months and 6 days. were I have to do 3 years 2 months and 6 days, and then after that 1/21/18 - Discharge of a probation violation I have to start my second sentence of 6 years in which ends 1-18-24, and then the third ~~1-18-30~~ which is my current MR date, and then the fourth of 2 1/2 and then the start 2 1/2 years which releases me off probation 1-18-30, I'll be 42.

I do believe the Governor could ~~address~~ use his power to get my time ran concurrent and give me my time credit of 3 years 2 mo and 6 days and let me out early 1-18-21
