I WAS JAILED and the next Day given A signitur Bond.

The jail sentence keeps me from being my mothers care giver. My Brothers And Sister have no time to care for my mother. I wasn't going to put her in A home when I WAS arrested I moved my mother to my brothers home. Now he has no time to care for her. She is Quarantined by herself. They neighbors provide minimal care for her. On 4-3-20 she was hospitalized for low blood sugar. Down to 80 I talked to her on the phone from Drison. Her speech was slurd and she wasn't making any sents. I had to beg the Sargent on duty to allow me another call. He did. I called my brother went to check on her and called 911. Shortly After the ambulance reached her she went into A diabetic coma. she recovered overnight she ~~is~~ was Not eating properly. She is still Quarantined All alone to care for herself. she cries to me everytime I talk to her on the phone. The covid 19 has us All In its grips. I have COPD and Heart Disease that could possible kill me. I certify that the information in this application is true to the best of my knowledge. I contract covid 19
