While driving from a training event, I was pulled over due to a headlight out. The vehicle registration was expired. I was in an unfamiliar area. I was approached by a Kenosha County Sheriff who told me to get out of the car, I stated that I feared for my safety, given the fact he did not acknowledge my invoking my constitutional provisions. I requested for a supervisor to be present, but I was denied that request. Once I was denied my constitutional rights and a supervisor on the scene, I remained silent. The Sheriff stated that he would break the window and force me out of the car. I rolled up my back windows left my passenger and driver window half way up. I sat there while he struck my window until it broke. Once he broke my window I fled. Due to it sounding like a bullet going through the window. I was recently targeted at a radio station shooting, so I fled out of fear. No one was injured nothing was broken or destroyed but my window. I was sentenced to 3 years 3 months.

12. Explain the extraordinary circumstances that you believe warrant a waiver of the Governor's eligibility rules. For example, an extraordinary circumstance could be, but is not necessarily, the fact that the conviction prohibits you from obtaining specific employment. However, the desire to hunt or possess a firearm for hunting purposes does not constitute extraordinary circumstances. Prior to my incarceration I was confirmed to be diagnosed with Lupus.

I have not been given the proper treatment nor am I at a facility that has the right and proper practitioners to aid me with my Lupus.

Lupus is an a disease that is an autoimmune disease that effect my the blood and joints.
