My crimes were motivated by the need or the want of money! Before the crimes were committed i had attended a family barbeque, where i consumed an enormous amount of alcohol! I had also smoked Crack Cocaine, eariler that day. I'm not using my condition as an excuse i'm merely telling you my story of what happened.

I do however believe that my distorted mind played a big part in my in my thinking that led to my crimes. I know that i would never be involved in any criminal activity with a sober mind. I am an admitted alcoholic/drug addict, who's mother and father were both alcoholics! I've had some success with AA and NA. My problem has been finding a job!!!!!! I know if i had a job and were committed to sobriety i could be a contributing member of society.

On the night in question, i had been out with my wife and brother, on the way home i decided to stop at my nephews house for a plate of Barbeque. My wife was suppose to be waiting in the car to take me home but she left me Drunk. I passed out and when i came to i left walking to go home. On my way home i thought i saw an opportunity to get some money! I went into a house as the family sat outside watching fire works, on the 4th of July, thinking there were purses in there with money in them. That was the first Burglary.

Leaving there i picked up a small bike, hoping to ride it home only to have the chain break on me in front of the second house! Believing that no one was home i burglarized this resident also. Please read attached sheet!

12. Explain the extraordinary circumstances that you believe warrant a waiver of the Governor's eligibility rules. For example, an extraordinary circumstance could be, but is not necessarily, the fact that the conviction prohibits you from obtaining specific employment. However, the desire to hunt or possess a firearm for hunting purposes does not constitute extraordinary circumstances.

I am 64 years old with a couple of underlining health conditions. High blood pressure and Hep C to be exaact. According to WI s. 302. 113 I may petition the court for early release if i'm 60 years of age or older having served 10 years for the bifurcated sentence. If i'm 65 years of age and have served 5 years of confindment i'm eligible, so long as i don't have a class A or B felony. I will have served 15 years July 2020 As of right now i'm un able to get the treatment i need due to my time structure! I feel under a plea agreèment i shouldn't have recieved the maximum sentence and then have them ran consecutive! having said all of this i'm asking to have my time at least ran concurrent. I shouldn't have had my life taken away for one bad night! ~~Sure i'm so very sorry for my victim and i wish i could take that night back.~~ I would do anything to make it right with my victim. Just to add my most serious crime is a C class felony. During my sentencing, i spoke to the victim and apologized. Today i still feel the same way, the victim was a nice lady and shouldn't of had to go through what i put her through. I'm so

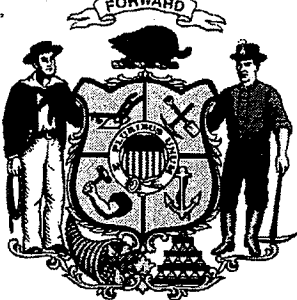

I had never done a house burglary before and it had been i believe 30 years since i had done a burglary period. This second burglary is where things got out of hand. someone was there and i victimized them by taking their money, pushing them around and assaulting them sexually! I believed at that time that the sexual contact was consensual! not realizing that the victim only agreed because of the fear they felt. without getting into to much detail i will say there was a brief moment of oral sex|| and some touching of private parts. there was no penis to vaginal contact as in penetration. i got no self enjoyment out of the moment i speak of in fact|| i am ashamed of my actions and how i treated the victim! i wasn't raised like that and i wish that i could take back that night. I wish that i could make amends to the victim, i would do anything to bring her some sense of security. She was a decent lady and didn't deserve what happend to her. I despise that kind of behavior. I don't sit around thinking of ways to victimize people all i want to do is put this part of my life behind me but i find that very difficult to do. I know that i will take any kind of treatment in or out to prevent this from ever happening again. I would like to be an advocate for victims of crimes such as mine. I don't like reliving that night! please know that i in no way form or fashion intend to minimise the nature or seriousness of my crimes and i take full resposibility for what happened. Your petition requesting a review by the Program Review Committee (PRC) for release under s. 302.113 (9g) was received and reviewed.

You have petitioned under the criteria of being 60 years of age and served at least 10 years of the term of confinement in prison portion of the bifurcated sentence(s). You do not meet the statutory requirements to petition for release consideration under s. 302.113 (9g).

To be statutorily eligible you must serve 10 years on each sentence. Currently you are incarcerated on Brown County Case 05CF0708, Counts 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5. Each of these sentences is running consecutively, with the incarceration time for Counts 1-4 being 10 years or less. You will not meet statutory eligibility for early release under this criteria until you have served at least 10 years of the sentence for Count 5.
