AT MY INTERVIEW THE OFFICER SAID I MAY BE CHARGED WITH INAPPROPRIATE TOUCHING. ACCORDING TO THE ASST. D.A. NEXT DAY MY GRANDDAUGHTER HAD ASKED TO USE MY CAR THE NEXT DAY SO HER AND HER MOTHER COULD USE MY CAR. I TOLD HER THE WAY THE WEATHER WAS AND WITH MY DNS. IT WOULD NOT BE A GOOD IDEA. SHE WAS SITTING BY THE TABLE AND I REGARDED FROM BEHIND. TOUCHING HER BREASTS. SHE WAS RILLY CLOTHED AND SAID THAT WAS FINE. THERE WAS NO ASSAULT OR SEXUAL CONTACT.

MY OTHER GRANDDAUGHTER SAT ON MY LAP AND I KISSED HER STOMACH. AND MADE HER LAUGH. I DID NOT HAVE ANY SEXUAL CONTACT OR ASSAULT. EITHER OF THEM. AT THE DAY OF SENTENCING THE D.A. SAID IT SHOULD BE SEXUAL ASSAULT. MY PSYCHOLOGIST THAT I WAS SEEING FOR PTSD, AND MY PHYSIOLOGIST BOTH SAID - NO TO MY AGE AND THAT WAS NOT THEM TO MYSELF MY FAMILY OR COMMUNITY. MY TIME WOULD BE BETTER SPENT COUNTING MY THIRTY EIGHT HOME.

12. Explain the extraordinary circumstances that you believe warrant a waiver of the Governor's eligibility rules. For example, an extraordinary circumstance could be, but is not necessarily, the fact that the conviction prohibits you from obtaining specific employment. However, the desire to hunt or possess a firearm for hunting purposes does not constitute extraordinary circumstances.

SINCE MY INCARCERATION I HAD NO TICKET. HAVEN'T BEEN IN ANY TROUBLE WALKED IN SECURITY OFFICE - RECORDS VALUE - STAFF OFFICER AS CUSTOMER WITH MY AGE WITH ALL THAT'S GOING ON, I WOULD LIKE TO BE HOME WITH MY WIFE OF 51 YEARS. AND THE REST OF MY FAMILY. THAT HAS SUPPORTED ME THE LAST 4 1/2 YEARS.

ON THE DAY OF THE WARDEN'S CRASH OUT I WAS IN SOUTH D.A. I CALL THE CLARK COUNTY OFFICE TOLD THEM I WOULD TURN MYSELF IN THAT FRIDAY NIGHT WHEN I CAME HOME. THE CHIEF TOLD ME HE WOULDN'T ENFORCE THE WARRANTS. I TURNED MYSELF IN THAT FRIDAY NIGHT. WAS NO NEED WITH TO.
