


Dear Peg,

Hello, my name is David Quick, and I'm an inmate at Sturtevant Transitional facility, I'll be 63 next month. My new cellie Robert Buffham, gave me your name and said you were an advocate. My situation and his are the same, sex offenders with really no resources other than a prison job. My family has disowned me since my arrest in Jan. 2012. In the 8 ½ years I've not received a letter, call or any correspondence at all. My release looms in the near future, Jan 2022. I pled no contest to one count of 2nd degree sex assault with 3 counts of 1st read in at sentencing. I will face 10 years of extended supervision in one of the worst counties in Wisconsin (Waukesha). Do you have any experience with dealing with STF? Staffs' attitude is one of complete uncaring. The favorite statement is "Don't come back if you don't like it!" Healthcare is a joke. I myself suffered from Bell's palsy due to not getting treatment for swollen glands on a Saturday morning. They kept saying you'll have to wait until Monday; all I wanted was a shot of antibiotics. On Monday morning I was finally taken to the hospital by ambulance. STF is notorious for not allowing sex offenders out on work release. I came here after being sent to a work center (Gordon Corr. Center) by mistake. Once they realized I needed meds for a seizure I suffered I had to be moved due to their lack of on-site HSU at GCC.

My first 6 years were spent at Stanley Corr. Institute and I finally made it to a project crew (7 inmates out of 1640) due to my good record. I'm classified as minimum community custody since Oct. 2018. I have received a minor ticket here, and a fabricated major ticket at Prairie du Chien Corr. Institute. I was confronted by a cellie as to my case and was threatened with death by him. Realizing I would lose my community custody if I didn't lock back in the cell I was instructed to file a SPN on him. This I did and spent 21 days in TLU, upon my release I was given a conduct report for "Sexual Conduct". My cellies (3) made up a story, stating that I came into the cell and after seeing a cellies photo of his children, began flicking my tongue "in a sexual manner" and said... I'm like that, I'm a snake, and I'm just testing the air. At the hearing the Captain came back after 30 min. He said (shaking his head), "Yeah, this is a tough one, but I have to stand behind my lieutenants" judgment and find you guilty. He appeared upset. I further appealed to the warden but he stood behind his captain. I left it at that. Prior to this I had 2 minor tickets, that's all.

Now I find myself struggling to get work release. I've jumped thru all these hoops, am doing Carey guides, am a lead tutor in their classroom, having gotten all 36's (max) on job evaluations. I'll be receiving my HSED in a couple of weeks. Like I said I did get a minor ticket after being fired from the kitchen (which is notorious). I have done their employability course, viewed an EEOC tele-conference, and have worked at a job now going on 8 mos. I've been ready for work release since Aug. 2019. An individual, who was fired the same day I was, got granted work release 6 weeks after his firing, he was not a sex offender. I was told by the sergeant who fired me at that time, "I've reviewed your case, and I know this warden, and you'll never get outside the fence! You'll rot until you leave, you smart mouthed asshole! That is just an example of the unprofessional conduct by staff here. What can I do? Check out released inmates from here and I know you won't believe what you hear from them. I'm going to continue to "stay off the radar" as they put it, keep helping others with their education, and maybe after being granted the "priveledge" of clearance outside the fence privileges after their "big staffing, I'll get the chance to earn money for a car, dishes, towels, clothes, and virtually everything a person needs to live since otherwise I'll walk out with nothing. This is a transitional facility so who knows maybe their hate will subside. I'll work to get a fresh start without having to acquire monies in "other ways". Who knows maybe even guys like me will get a second chance, where have I heard that before, hmm.

I'll close for now; I need no stamps, maybe just a shoulder now and then. Pray for me Peg. Good luck..... oh yeah don't mention my name or my rear is grass!!
