If you are recommended for a parole grant/release, the time frame within which you shall be released, as established by the Chairperson of the Parole Commission, shall be reflected in the grant/order.

GENERAL REASONS FOR ACTION TAKEN

1. You have developed an adequate plan, but will need Agent's verification.
2. Your institutional conduct has been satisfactory.
3. Your program participation has NOT been satisfactory.
4. Release at this time would involve an unreasonable risk to the public.
5. You have NOT served sufficient time for punishment.

COMMISSION COMMENTS

You were seen today for parole consideration for case 99CF3008 Ct #1, Substantial Battery and case 99CF4425 Ct #1, felony Murder (PTAC). Your MR date for these cases is 8-25-29 and your PED date is 8-30-20. You have now served approximately 20 years and 10 months on the combined 42 year sentence.

Note: Consecutive to Ct #1 of the 1995 case is a Ct #2, Attempt Robbery (PTAC), which has a 5 year Imposed and Stayed term with 3 years probation.

According to the record the 1995 case involved you restraining a victim while a co-actor stole his wallet. After an initial incarceration, which began on 10-17-95, you were released on your MR date on 2-23-99. Your term of community supervision was subsequently revoked on 10-11-99 for violations which included Absconding from supervision (4-8-99), striking a man with an axe handle in order to commit a robbery (8-26-99) and then the very next day participating in another robbery which resulted in you shooting and killing one man and shooting and injuring 4 others. You admit to the behaviors stating that you caught up in this lifestyle and were full of anger. When one victim approached your group acting as though he had a gun, you left the scene and returned with a gun. The individual who approached earlier was shot as were the others, but it was this individuals brother who was killed. In telling your story, you expressed remorse for the harm you've committed.

At 49-years of age this is your 2nd incarceration and you have a lengthy criminal record, noting that you also served time during this term for the revocation of case 95CF2480, Robbery (PTAC) (MRV) wherein 1 year, 3 months and 13 days was ordered.

Institution Conduct: During this incarceration you've had a total of 25 minor and 41 major conduct reports with the last major (Disobeying Orders / Disruptive Conduct / Disrespect) occurring on 1-2-19. The Last minor was in March of 2019.

Identified Treatment needs: You have unmet treatment needs of SUD-3 (Wait List) and CBP (Wait List). To your credit, you have completed Anger Management (6-19-19). It is further noted that you have been enrolled in an academic program. The last report form this program (2/20) noted unsatisfactory behaviors.

Release Planning: Your release plan notes that you would like to reside with your cousin, Dwight Allen in Milwaukee. This was discussed along with another plan to reside in a halfway house sponsored by an Islamic Center. A support letter was received from this group and they have also planned to assist with employment and other program opportunities. This may be workable, but will need your agent's approval when time frames are more appropriate.

Transition through security has been unremarkable, noting that you have failed to transition out of Maximum security. A sustained period of positive adjustment is what the Commission seeks to see before an endorsement

for a reduction in security will be offered. Then a continued period of positive adjustment at each level with completed programming and transitions through reduced security will be your way forward toward release. This is a critical part of your release evaluations and as a PMR sentence it is even more critical that you separate yourself from the behaviors of the past so as not to continue to present as someone with elevated risk factors.

Based on the nature and severity of the case, the fact that you have unmet treatment needs, conduct issues, an elevated risk rating on an actuarial risk assessment tool and a poor history of community supervision it is clear that you continue to present as an unreasonable risk and that more time is warranted so as not to depreciate the severity of your offending behaviors and therefore the decision by the Commission will be to defer your case for 12 months.

Dear Parole Commissioners,

This letter is being sent from Nazir Al-Mujaahid, Program Manager of the Ibrahim House Program which serves Muslims reentering society from incarceration. We are sending this on behalf of Tracy Anderson, 275721.

We are looking forward to his release and would like to inform you of our reentry program which he qualifies for. The Milwaukee Islamic Da'wa Center facilitates the Ibrahim House Program as part of an independent living and growth program for Muslim men. The Ibrahim House is a 4 unit apartment building located one and a half blocks from our local masjid/mosque. Participants benefit from the two weekly food pantries that we provide for the community.

We provide housing upon release for up to 10 returning citizens at a time. Once a Muslim is released, we meet with their parole officer to show them the living space, nowadays DOC has been conducting a virtual walkthrough of the living area until the CoVid19 restrictions are fully lifted.

We customize a Manhood and Islamic curriculum which includes trainings in areas such as;

- Leadership development
- Gainful employment
- Driver's license assistance
- Child support and other debt obligations
- Goal setting and attainment
- Community stakeholder and volunteering
- Fatherhood and family training
- Understanding Arabic
- Manners and morals in Islam
- Marriage and family

We would be honored to have Tracy join the Ibrahim House program and help him transition to living a productive and crime free life back in the community and work to repair some of the harm he did in the past.
