Filing on line by 11 21 20:

Who is eligible for the Economic Impact Payment?

U.S. citizens, permanent residents and [qualifying resident aliens](#) who: Have a valid Social Security number, /Could not be claimed as a dependent of another taxpayer, and /Had adjusted gross income under certain limits.

Who should use Non-Filers: Enter Payment Info Here to provide information to receive the Economic Impact Payment?

Use the Non-Filers: Enter Payment Info Here tool if you do not normally and [are not planning to file](#) a federal income tax return for 2019 for any reason including:

- Your income is less than \$12,200/You're married filing jointly and together your income is less than \$24,400/You have no income

Non-Filers who have not received an Economic Impact Payment need to provide information by November 21.

While most eligible U.S. taxpayers have [automatically received](#) their Economic Impact Payment, some may need to provide their information by November 21 if they have not received their payment yet.

If you don't usually file a tax return and you have not received your Economic Impact yet, the IRS may not have enough information to determine your eligibility. This includes those receiving the federal benefits listed below.

- Those receiving Social Security retirement, disability (SSDI), survivor benefits
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI) recipients
- Recipients of Veterans Affairs Compensation and Pension (C&P) benefits
- Individuals who receive Railroad Retirement (RRB) benefits

You can submit your information online by November 21 using the Non-Filers tool.

Information you will need to provide

- Full name, current mailing address and an email address
- Date of birth and valid Social Security number
- Bank account number, type and routing number, if you have one
- Identity Protection Personal Identification Number (IP PIN) you received from the IRS earlier this year, if you have one
 - Taxpayers who previously have been issued an Identity Protection PIN but lost it, must use the [Get an IP PIN](#) tool to retrieve their numbers
- Driver's license or state-issued ID, if you have one
- For each qualifying child during 2019: name, Social Security number or Adoption Taxpayer Identification Number and their relationship to you or your spouse

What to expect

Follow these steps in order to provide your information:

- Create an account by providing your email address and phone number; and establishing a user ID and password.
- You will be directed to a screen where you will input your filing status (Single or Married filing jointly) and personal information.
- **Note:** Make sure you have a valid Social Security number for you (and your spouse if you were married at the end of 2019) unless you are filing "Married Filing Jointly" with a 2019 member of

To fill out the form and get your payment, follow these steps:

Write "EIP 2020" on the top of your form.

Filing Status Section:

Check the filing status that applies to you.

Enter your name, mailing address, and Social Security number.

- If you are married and you're filing a joint return for you and your spouse, you have to enter your Social Security number and your spouse's.
- If you or your spouse was an active member of the U.S. Armed Forces any time in 2019, you need to enter one spouse's Social Security number. For the other spouse, you can enter either their Social Security number or their individual taxpayer identification number (ITIN).

Standard Deduction Section:

Check any of the boxes that apply to you (and your spouse, if you're filing jointly).

Remember that if someone else can claim you as a dependent on their taxes, you don't qualify for an Economic Impact Payment.

Dependents section:

Enter the information for your children who qualify for the Economic Impact Payment. Your children only qualify for a payment if they were age 16 or younger on December 31, 2019, and if they lived with you for more than half of 2019.

The information you'll need is:

- Your child's full name;
- Their Social Security number or Adoption Taxpayer Identification Number; and
- Their relationship to you.

In column 4, you will:

- Check the "child tax credit" box if your child has a Social Security number
- Check the "credit for other dependents" box if your child has an Adoption Taxpayer Identification number.

Income and Tax sections (Lines 1-11):

Enter \$1 on lines 2b, 7b, and 8b.

Enter \$0.00 on line 11.

- Leave every other line in this section blank.

Refund section:

- If you want your payment deposited directly into your bank, put your bank account information in lines 21b through 21d. The account must be in the name of the filer who is receiving the Payment. If you do not have a bank account, leave this section blank and you will be sent a paper check.

- Leave the rest of this section blank.

Sign Here section:

- Sign your name. If you are married and filing jointly, your spouse needs to sign, too. By signing, you are saying that everything on the form is true, and you will face a penalty if you have lied.

- If you have an identity protection personal identification number (also called an IP PIN), enter it. If you don't have an IP PIN, you can leave that space blank.

- In addition, a simplified return filer may enter the identifying information of any third-party designee, if applicable, at the bottom of page 2 of Form 1040 or Form 1040-SR.

Mail Your Simplified Tax Return:

- Mail your completed form to the IRS at the following address:

Remember, you have to mail your form by October 30, 2020, if you want to get your payment this year.

Filing Status

- Single Married filing jointly Married filing separately (MFS) Head of household (HOH) Qualifying widow(er) (QW)

Check only one box.

If you checked the MFS box, enter the name of spouse. If you checked the HOH or QW box, enter the child's name if the qualifying person is a child but not your dependent.

Form fields for personal information: Your first name and middle initial, Last name, Your social security number, Spouse's social security number, Home address, Apt. no., Presidential Election Campaign, City, town or post office, state, and ZIP code, Foreign country name, Foreign province/state/county, Foreign postal code.

Standard Deduction

- Someone can claim: You as a dependent, Your spouse as a dependent, Spouse itemizes on a separate return or you were a dual-status alien

Age/Blindness

- You: Were born before January 2, 1955, Are blind, Spouse: Was born before January 2, 1955, Is blind

Dependents (see instructions):
